

Brandie Garner GAHRA President - Welcome and greeting from GAHRA .

John Emery- U.S. Inspection Group, Inc. - REAC UPCS/NSPIRE Updates 2021 This is a session where every Housing Authority will benefit for attending. It will discuss recent REAC changes and talk about how you ways to improve your REAC scores.

Tuesday, July 13, 2021 Afternoon Sessions 1:30 - 4:30 pm

Plumbing Repair - This class will talk about and cover problems associated with plumbing service requests that most Housing Authorities deal with on a daily basis. Topics will include major fixture components such as commodes, bath and shower fixtures, kitchen and bath sinks and associated drains. It will talk about the different components of each and explain the operation and how to replace and maintain them as necessary. It will discuss different types of chemicals, drain openers, and how to use them safely. This session should be very helpful to anyone who has to maintain and troubleshoot them in a safe manner.

Air Conditioning Mechanical and Electrical - This 3 hour training is an introduction and overview for HVAC technicians no matter his or her skill level. It will discus air conditioning systems and the fundamental of the refrigeration cycle. It will cover the 4 major components of an AC system, how they work, and how to maintain them. The class covers topics such as preventative maintenance and the troubleshooting skills needed to work on and operate the equipment. Topics covered in this class will include Safety procedures - Lock out Tag out, Basic AC Refrigeration cycle, Electrical and Mechanical components of AC system, Schematic design of components, Preventative Maintenance, and Troubleshooting common problems.

Lock Repair - This class will show attendees the most common type locks that we have on our properties as well show them how to properly maintain them. It will show the advantages of using as well as the disadvantages of using the core locks with the removable cores verses the standard deadbolt lock. It will also show you how to save time and money by having a good lock and key system in place. Locks and keys are a very important part of the Authority operation and has a very important part of keeping our residents safe and keep your Authority out of liability issues.

Wednesday, July 14, 2021 Morning Sessions

UPCS/NSPIRE Certification - Day One of this training will include an overview of the UPCS/NSPIRE coupled with in -depth study for the most critical inspectable areas. Using hundred of actual photos, our instructor will educate you on what to look for when entering every apartment. This training and checklist will ensure you are ready for your next REAC inspection. **This is a two day class and requires separate registration and additional fees**.

Electrical - This class is designed to be an overview of electricity and how it works. We will trace the path of electricity from the house meter to the panel box to each electrical device in the morning session. Topics includes: Safety, National Code awareness, electrical panel, and common electrical device installation and trouble shooting. The afternoon session will be hands on where you will actually get to wire several of the common electrical devices that is commonly used on a daily basis. This is an all day class.

R 410-A and Other Refrigerants - This class will answer many of the questions surrounding the current transition from R-22 to new alternative refrigerants to new alternative refrigerants including R-410A, MO-99, and other regional options. This course will address issues surrounding the differences in operating pressures and lubricants, how new refrigerants can impact equipment choices, tools and servicing. Topics covered in this class will include Safety, Properties of R-410A Refrigerant, Comparing R-410A to R-22 and Alternatives, Conversion from R-22 to R-410A, Interfacing Old and New Equipment, Service Guidelines, Repair or Replacement Options and Proper Charging Techniques.

Customer Service - Would better communication skills improve the service you provide to your customers, vendors and visitors? The first part of this class will address the skills you need to better serve your customers; even the frustrated, confused or even downright hostile customers. Are you having problems with getting residents to understand the importance of maintaining good housekeeping standards/ Sometimes the way you communicate with others can affect how they receive the information. The second part of the class will help you to develop good communication skills when educating your residents on the importance of maintaining good housekeeping standards.

Electric Motors - **This session** will cover a large variety of motors that are used in much of the equipment that we maintain. This is especially true for air conditioning where it may have several motors and can be very costly. This will talk about the different motors we use such as variable speed, shaded pole and split capacitor and more. Variable speed motors can cost several hundred dollars and you need to know how to check it before replacing. It will talk about the different type motors and how to properly troubleshoot and maintain them in good operating condition.

Every Housing Authority has water heaters and this class will be helpful to anyone who has to work on or maintain them in good operating condition.

Make Ready Maintenance - This session is an overview providing information on all aspects of importance and procedures of making units ready. Some of the topics that will be covered will include walking the make ready, accountability and documentation, organizing the make ready process scheduling contractors when necessary, timely completion of make readies and final inspection and follow up of the move in. Vacancies are a big part of our Authorities and it is most important that we turn these vacant units around in a timely manner in order to get them ready for the next family.
